Bolivian president Evo Morales resigned this week in what he is calling a coup, after his reelection sparked mass protests. Morales accepted political asylum in Mexico. Senator Jeanine Áñez declared herself the country's acting president.



Spanish authorities said this week that Venezuela's former spy chief, Major General Hugo Carvajal, has gone missing in Spain. Carvajal faces extradition to the U.S. where he is wanted on drug trafficking charges.



The *Walking Dead* star Christian Serratos has been cast as Selena in the upcoming Netflix drama *Selena: The Series*. The series also stars Ricardo Chavira, Gabriel Chavarria and Noemí González, among others.



Costa Rica's tourism board has launched the campaign #stopanimalselfies to discourage visitors from picking up and taking selfies with the country's wildlife like sloths and ocelots.



The Supreme Court is currently debating the case of DACA, with the court's conservative majority signalling that they may side with the Trump administration on ending the program. DACA has protected over 700,000 young people from deportation. A decision is expected in 2020.



Mexico has reportedly made arrests in connection with the murder of nine dual citizens last week in Northern Mexico.



Magnus Media and LatinWE announced a co-management deal launching with Sebastian "Sebas" Vitalobos' debut single. Magnus will co-manage and handle booking on the music side for LatinWE's content creators.



Recent Cinema From Spain returns to Miami on November 21st-24th. The films to be screened during the festival include "Santuario", "Litus", "Bufuel en el Laberinto de las Tortugas", "Yul", "Que Te Juegas?" and "Los Luvies y el Libro Mágico".



Maná announced the recipients of the Maná Scholarship Program in partnership with the band's Selva Negra Foundation and the Univision Foundation. The 15 winning students will receive \$10,000 towards their continued education.



Los Angeles City Councilwoman Monica Rodríguez announced a new mural project, "Rushing Waters", celebrating the San Fernando Valley's Native American heritage. The project, curated by muralist Levi Ponce, is the largest above-ground mural in the area at almost 10,000 square feet.



Endemol Shine Boomdog celebrates its two-year anniversary this month. Among the studios productions are "Mira Quien Baila", "MasterChef Mexico", "Nicky Jam: el Ganador", and "The Masked Singer Mexico". This week the company announced a development and production deal with Gaston Pavlovich ("The Irishmen").



Calibre 50, Beto Cuevas, Fariako, Leonel García, Alicia Keys, Miguel, Ozuna, Fito Páez, Milly Quezada, Residente, Carlos Rivera, Prince Royce and Tony Succar have joined the lineup of performers at the Latin GRAMMY Awards. Ángela Aguilar, Eduardo Caba (Visitante), Sofía Carson, Emilio Estefan, Mon Laferte, William Levy, Rudy Mancuso, Michael Peña and Dayanara Torres have joined as presenters. The awards air live on Univision tomorrow night.



Musician, composer and audio-visual producer Ignacio Peña is nominated for a Suncoast Regional EMMY Award for his documentary, "La Historia de Anormal." He has also just released a new single "Can It Wait?". The Suncoast Emmy Awards will take place in Orlando on December 14th.



ABC has plans for a follow up series to "Revenge" that will star a Latino immigrant character in addition to at least one of the original series stars.



Zoe Saldana plays the lead role in the new Netflix adaptation of Tembi Locke's memoir "From Scratch".



Chile's Pulsar music conference has been canceled this year due to the ongoing unrest in the country.
